## Grammar Explanation

## Making pronouns and nouns agree

- Make sure to use plural pronouns to refer to plural nouns and singular pronouns to refer to singular nouns.
  - o Example: The people in the room all raised their hands; the vote was unanimous.
- Demonstrative pronouns such as *this*, *that*, *these* and *those* must agree in number with the nouns they refer to or precede.
  - o Example: Crime is not a new phenomenon. It has always existed.
  - o Example: This book is more expensive than those books.
- Make sure to use singular pronouns when referring to indefinite pronouns such as
  everyone and when referring to nouns preceded by each or every.
  - o Example: **Every** criminal is responsible for **his** or **her** behavior.
  - o Example: **Everyone** should mind **his** or **her** own business.
- Be consistent in your use of pronouns.
  - o Example: You must remember to send in your taxes on time.
  - o Example: The Smiths are very responsible; they always pay their taxes early.
